## Workshop for expectant parents held

We held a workshop for expectant mothers and fathers on Saturday, November 30. With help from the Community Health and Welfare Section of the Jonan Ward Health & Welfare Center of Fukuoka City, we organized this workshop with 20 participants in 11 groups of expectant parents and a grandmother-to-be from the local community.

Child-rearing mothers talked about pregnancy, giving birth, and how they enjoy parenting, and also shared ideas on creative and effective childcare. This time, an instructor raising twins was also invited. The expectant parents took notes, held babies in their arms, and gained other valuable experiences.
